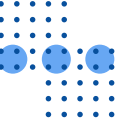

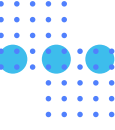

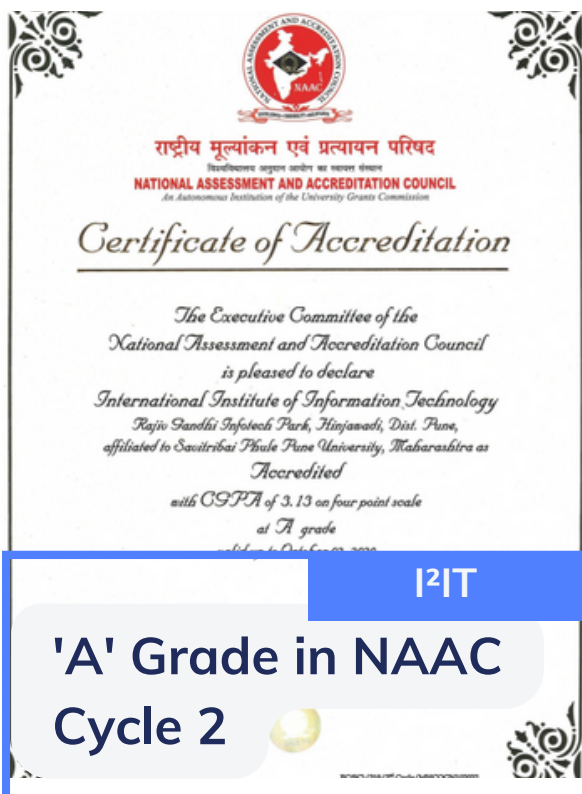

Collaboration with ISRO

Advancing Space Technologies for Disaster Management



The International Institute of Information Technology (I²IT), in collaboration with Registered Engineers for Disaster Relief (RedR) India, successfully hosted a one-week advanced course titled "Space Technologies for Early Warning and Monitoring of Extreme Weather Events and Hydro-Met Disasters." This initiative was part of the Capacity Building in Space-Based Disaster Management Support Program (DMSP) led by the Indian Institute of Remote Sensing (IIRS) and ISRO, Government of India.

KEY HIGHLIGHTS

Objective and Participation

The course aimed to advance Disaster Risk Reduction (DRR), Climate Change Adaptation, and Public Policy Analysis. Out of 120+ applicants nationwide, 25 participants from premier institutions and government bodies such as NDMA, NIDM, IIT Roorkee, and AIIMS were selected.

Inaugural Ceremony

Distinguished guests included Dr. R. Krishnan (IITM), Prof. N. Vinod Chandra Menon (NDMA), and Dr. Aruna M. Katara (Hope Foundation). These leaders emphasized the significance of integrating space technologies into disaster management.

Course Structure

The program featured 20 sessions, six hands-on activities, and two fieldwork sessions, blending theoretical and practical knowledge. Topics covered included satellite meteorology, remote sensing, AI/ML applications in disaster forecasting, drone technology, and QGIS for flood mapping.

Innovative Group Activity

Participants worked in teams to design end-to-end early warning systems for disasters such as floods, cyclones, and droughts. Teams presented their findings on the final day, showcasing practical applications of advanced geospatial tools and community-centric approaches.

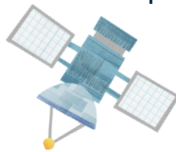

Announcement of Climate Studies and Disaster Management Centre (CSDMC)

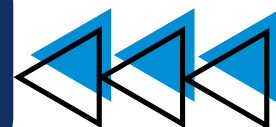

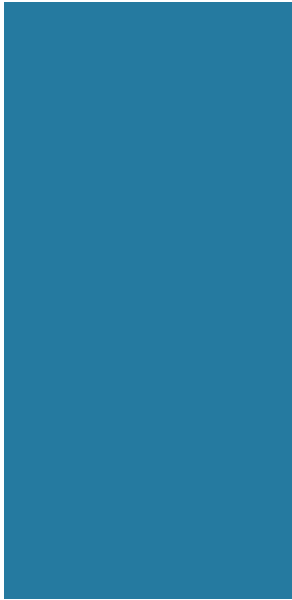

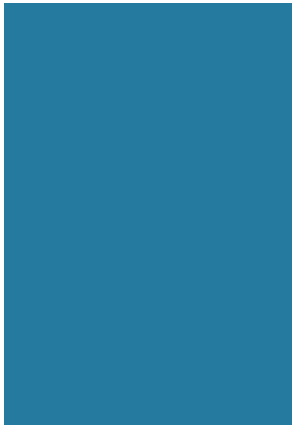

01 MY STORY: Idea to Impact

The session featured an engaging Q&A and networking opportunity, reinforcing FAMT's commitment to fostering entrepreneurship.

02 Fostering Innovation

Dr. Surojit Saha and the CEO of SchoolforAll conducted an interactive session for First-Year Engineering students at I²IT, discussing entrepreneurial opportunities, IIC's role in innovation, and career prospects in their company. 03 Industry Readiness

04 Empowering Through Knowledge

05 Lean Start-up and MVP Workshop

FAMT organized an online session led by Mr. Sanjeev Mishra, CEO of STAENZ Academy, where 130 students explored lean start-up methodologies and strategies for creating Minimum Viable Products. Practical tools like Helium 10 and Google Trends were introduced, equipping students with essential entrepreneurial skills to thrive in today's dynamic business environment.

06 High-Performance Computing

The program at I²IT covered AI-DL machine setup, Docker, data management, and user account management. Participants explored advanced image/video processing with OpenCV, OpenGL, and CUDA, along with deep learning and ML on embedded boards, gaining key AI-DL skills.

Technology & Innovation



01 Innovations in Solar Energy

FAMT students attended a technical session and field visit on solar energy. Mr. Rhishikesh Kondekar discussed advanced technologies like high-efficiency photovoltaic cells and solar water heaters. He also explained the PM Surya Ghar Yojana, covering subsidies, incentives, and the rooftop solar application process, fostering renewable energy awareness.

02 Astronomy Talk

The session by Mr. Arvind Paranjpe, Director of Nehru Planetarium, Worli, covered topics like Space Technology, Careers in Astronomy, Sky Gazing, Telescopes, and the Big Bang Theory. His insights inspired participants to explore astronomy and space sciences. The event seamlessly blended scientific knowledge with practical exploration, making it both educational and inspiring for all students of I²IT.

03 NICE Tech-Talk

Amish Agarwal, Senior Specialist Product Owner at NICE, delivered an insightful session on the latest trends in Blockchain Technologies at I²IT. The talk was followed by an engaging Quiz Program, adding an interactive element to the event.

04 Better English, Better Life

Dr. Shamika Agrawal, Regional Head - West India at ebek, discussed the Linguaskill assessment for English language proficiency and the CEFR levels offered by ebek under the theme of "Better English, Better Life at I²IT.

05 AI Awareness Program

A program on Artificial Intelligence (AI) was conducted for 9th and 10th-grade students at Damle School to raise awareness about AI technology. The students showed great interest, asking insightful questions, and received praise from Mr. Bhagwan Mote, the Headmaster. The session, attended by 55 students, ended with excellent feedback and an invitation for future informative sessions.

06 High-Performance Computing

The program included hands-on training on AI-DL machine setup, Docker usage, data management, and managing user accounts. Students also explored advanced image and video processing applications using OpenCV, OpenGL, and CUDA, along with demonstrations on deep learning models and machine learning on embedded boards, equipping attendees with essential skills for AI and deep learning advancements.



13 Global Hackathon Call For Code

Students of I²IT were invited to participate in the Call for Code hackathon, addressing global challenges like climate change and education using generative AI. They gained hands-on experience with IBM Watson AI tools, networked with industry experts from Persistent and IBM, and attended a session on watsonx. The competition offered \$50,000 USD in prizes, with winning solutions deployed globally, along with free training on the IBM watsonx platform.

15 Life Skills Programme

The Life Skills Training Programme organized in collaboration with Rubicon and Barclays, upskilled B.E. and MCA students in corporate readiness, soft skills, and interview techniques.

Sessions covered Interview Skills, Corporate Readiness, Group Discussions, and Online Profile Management through presentations, videos, and expert talks. Mock interviews provided hands-on experience with real-life corporate scenarios, ensuring comprehensive learning.

17 Deep Dive into AI and its Application

I²IT organized a workshop on AI & its applications, led by Mr. Ankit Kumar from Design Tech System Pvt. Ltd., Pune. The session introduced MATLAB for AI & ML, covering algorithm development, data analysis, and model creation.

14 Workshop on Safeguarding Your Research

FAMT organized a workshop titled "Safeguarding Your Research: How to Identify the Right Journals and Avoid Predatory Ones". The session focused on strategies for identifying reputable journals and avoiding predatory publications, empowering researchers to protect their work and enhance academic credibility.

The workshop saw active participation from 11 faculty members and 2 staff members.

16 Entrepreneurship Challenge Competition

The Entrepreneurship Challenge Competition (ECC) 2023 saw the participation of 120 aspiring student entrepreneurs who presented 44 innovative business ideas across two tracks. These ideas spanned diverse fields, including payment innovations, health management, IoT-based solutions, and advanced surveillance systems.

18 Session on Artificial Intelligence in Telecommunication

I²IT hosted an expert session on AI in Telecommunication with Mr. Gaurav Kumar Raut and Prof. Ashvini Kulkarni, focusing on network performance, AI-driven optimizations, and career opportunities in telecom. The session empowered students with industry-ready insights.

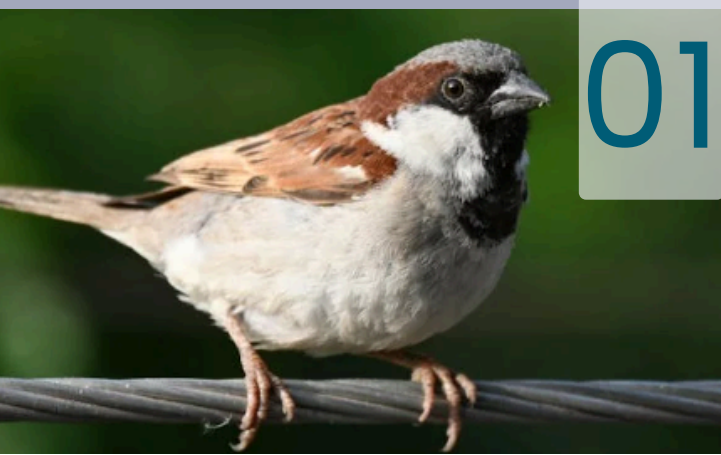

Waste Management

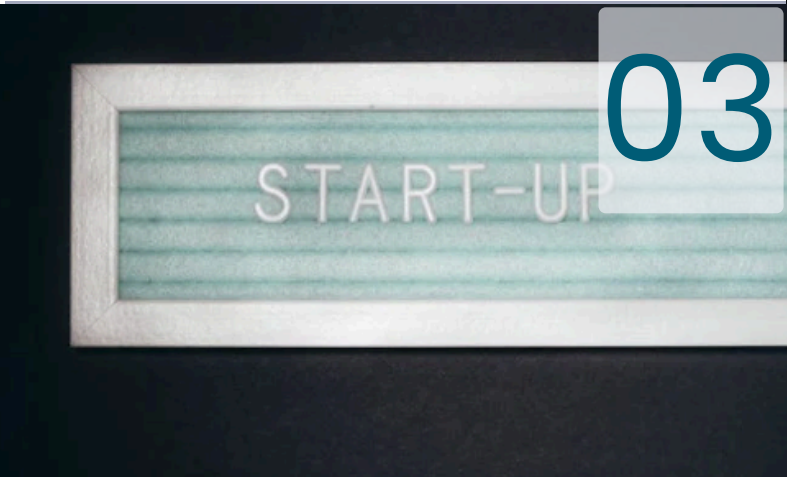

A total of 23 volunteers actively participated, focusing on cleaning the campus and raising awareness about the importance of maintaining a clean and healthy environment.

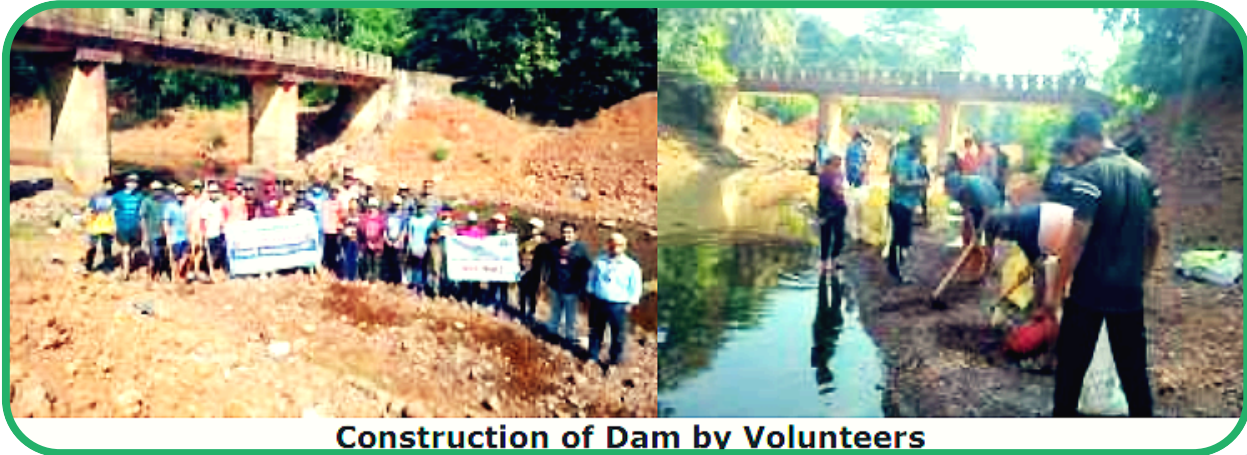

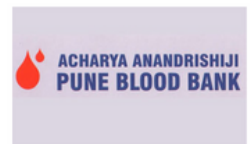

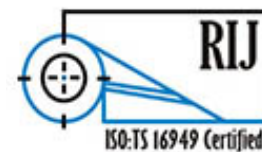
