#### Together, We Said NO to Ragging!

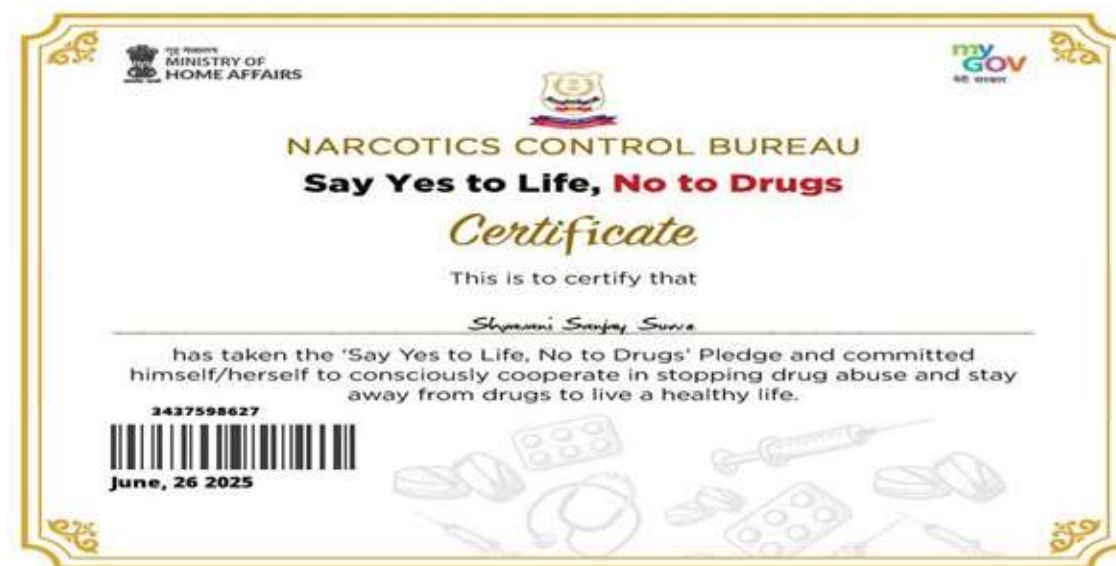

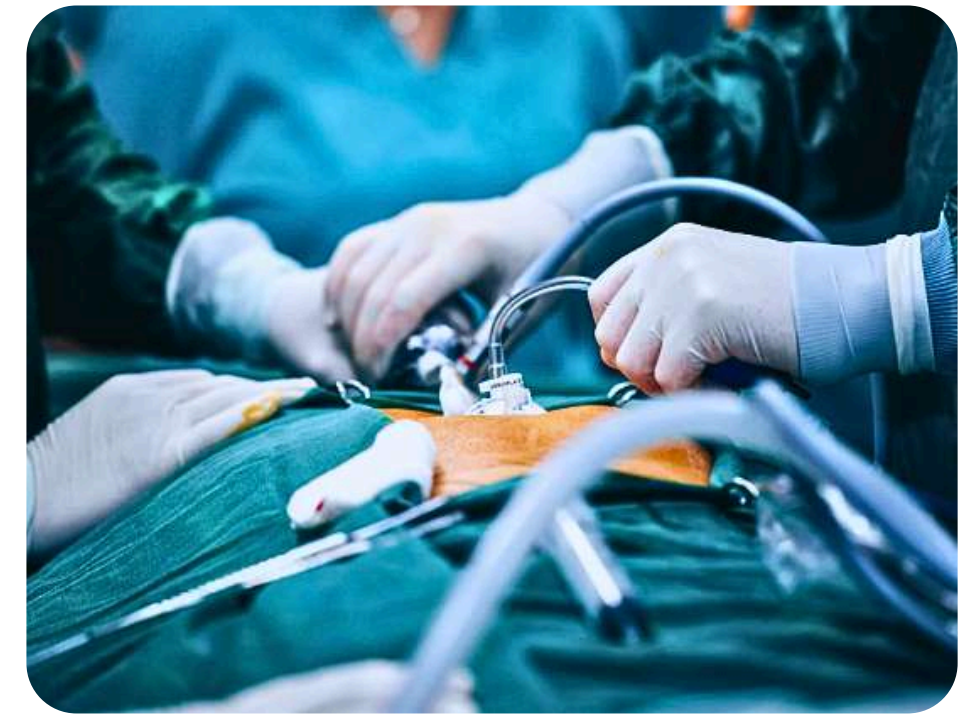

# Institutional Rankings & Awards

## Times Engineering

FAMT secured 112th rank (overall 115th), and I<sup>2</sup>IT secured 124th rank (overall 128th) among the top private engineering institutes in India, also featuring in the Top 175 Engineering Institutes Overall Rankings 2025.

## Outlook iCare

FAMT has secured the 60th rank, and I<sup>2</sup>IT has secured the 77th rank among the top 200 private engineering institutes in India

## India Today

FAMT secured 178th and I<sup>2</sup>IT 199th in the India Today Best Engineering Colleges Rankings 2025. FAMT also ranked 5th among Mumbai University institutes and 23rd in Maharashtra, standing out as the only Konkan institute featured in the rankings.

## The Week (Hansa Research)

I<sup>2</sup>IT ranks 20th in Maharashtra, 27th in West Zone, and 167th nationally among private engineering institutes, while FAMT ranks 21st in Maharashtra, 28th in West Zone, and 176th nationally, also securing 6th among Mumbai University-affiliated institutes. 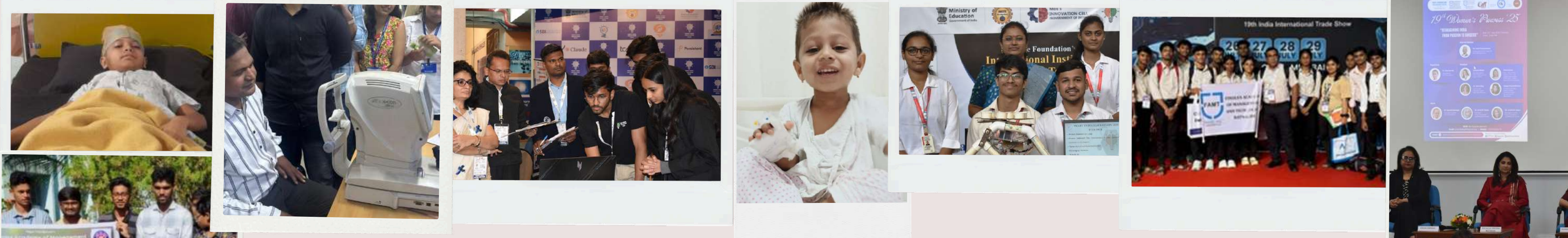
